

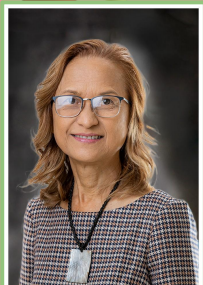

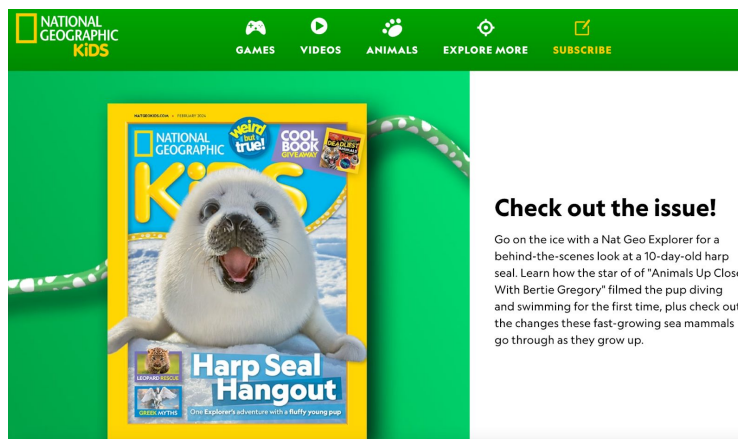

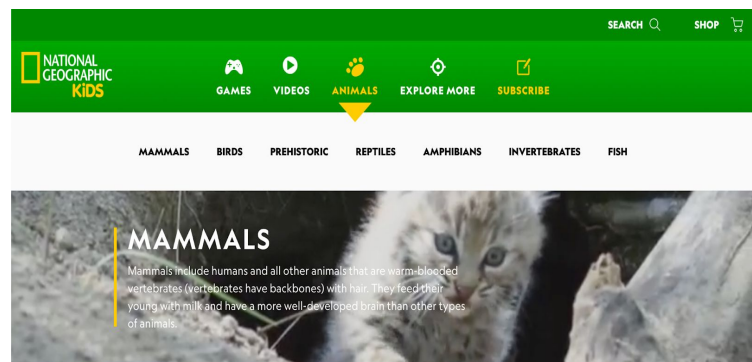

Dr. Theresa Magpuri-Lavell

The School of Education proudly welcomes Dr. Theresa Magpuri-Lavell to its distinguished faculty team. Her arrival is met with great enthusiasm, as her expertise and dedication are sure to enhance the educational journey of students. The community looks forward to the meaningful contributions she will bring.

Dr. Magpuri-Lavell served as the Executive Director of the Sandra Dungan Deal Center for Early Language and Literacy at Georgia College. Prior to that, she held positions as Associate Professor, Assistant Dean of Outreach, and Scholar in Residence for Jefferson County Public Schools at Bellarmine University in Louisville, KY.

Her academic achievements include earning a doctorate in Instruction and Curriculum Leadership with a specialization in Reading Education from the University of Memphis. Her research focuses on early literacy, foundational reading skills, reading fluency, and building teacher capacity in the science of teaching reading. Her work has been featured in prominent journals, including the *Journal of Adolescent and Adult Literacy*, the *Journal of Educational Research*, and *Advances in Literary Studies*.

Before transitioning to higher education, Dr. Magpuri-Lavell taught elementary school for a decade in Massachusetts, Tennessee, and Japan, following her completion of a Master's in Education from Lesley University.

Dr. Jackysha Green Awarded Tenure and Promotion



It is with great pride that we celebrate the well-deserved tenure and promotion of Dr. Jackysha N. Green to Associate Professor at the University of Guam! For those who have had the privilege of working alongside Dr. Green, we know her not just as an exceptional educator and leader but also as someone you can always count on anytime. She is a dedicated mentor, an advocate for students, and a friend who brings warmth and enthusiasm to everything she does.

From her early days as a Kindergarten teacher in the Guam Department of Education (GDOE) to her leadership as Elementary Education Program Chair at UOG, Dr. Green has poured her heart into shaping the future of education. Through initiatives like the Palau 2+2 Partnership and the Yap Individual Degree Plan she has opened doors for students across the Pacific region. The Palau partnership cohort of 20 Palau teachers who have 2-year degrees will graduate a BAE degree in Elementary Education with Special Education specialization this May 2025 in Palau. The Yap teachers with 2-year degrees and will complete their BAE in Elementary Education. As Field Experience Coordinator, Dr. Green ensures that aspiring teachers gain hands-on experience in the classrooms, preparing them for success in their classroom.

Dr. Green's research and grant writing included the Dokdok Project which reflects her commitment to making a real difference in education. Beyond academics, Dr. Green has a heart for community engagement, enriching SOE and UOG through programs like the Children's Fair, GDOE ASPIRE Program, and UOG Charter Day.

Congratulations, Dr. Dean Olah!

Dr. Dean Olah applied for the Taiwan Fellowship, established by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA), in June 2024. In October, he was notified that his research proposal, "Teacher Training Programs, Guam, and Taiwan: A Comparative Study," had been accepted, and he was awarded the fellowship. As part of the fellowship, he will spend a minimum of three months in Taiwan, from May through August 2025, conducting research at the Center for Chinese Studies at the National Central Library and National Taiwan Normal University (NTNU). His study will examine general education requirements, theoretical coursework, qualifying tests, practical training, curriculum, and teaching methods.

Additionally, Dr. Olah was invited to and attended a luncheon for Taiwan President Lai Ching-te on December 5 at the Hyatt Ballroom. The event focused on opportunities for Guam-Taiwan collaboration in tourism, culture, health care, aquaculture, hydroponics, education, engineering, construction, and alternative energy.

University of Alabama UNITE STEM Partnership

The School of Education's collaboration with the University of Alabama in Huntsville (UAH) Operation UNITE STEM Team was invaluable. Their expertise provided a strong framework for STEM materials applicable to the School of Education. Hands-on activities were enthusiastically received, paving the way for more interactive sessions. The partnership, spearheaded by Dean Aguon, Dr. Green, and Dr. Sablan, emphasized pedagogical development and effective STEM integration.

Dr. Zena Sablan's and Dr. Jackysha Green's students gained hands-on experience with straw launchers while conducting practicum sessions in GDOE classrooms at Harry S. Truman, M.U. Lujan, Agana Heights, and Marcial Sablan, reaching a total of 114 students. This experience not only strengthened our future teachers' expertise but also contributed to the development of STEAM-aligned unit plans.

Dr. Rebecca Grunzke's Research

After returning last summer from a five-week bioarchaeology field school in Baia Mare, Romania—where she worked on cleaning and bio-profiling a set of human remains from a 14th- to 18th-century cemetery—Rebecca continued her research on Japanese theme parks as informal educational institutions.

Along with her co-editor, Dr. Andrew Grunzke, she submitted the final manuscript for their edited volume, *The Female Teacher on Television*. She looks forward to receiving the page proofs next week and promoting the book upon its publication later this semester.

Palau Ministry of Education, UOG, and GDOE: Walkthrough Sessions

Honoring a Legacy of Excellence: Celebrating the Retirement of Dr. Michelle Santos

SOE saw the retirement of long time faculty member, Dr. Michelle Santos. Dr. Santos, an associate professor of secondary education, was the Division Chair for the Professional Teacher Preparation (PTP) division. She was also chair for the BAE in Secondary Education and the Chair of the Masters of Art in Teaching. Dr. Santos came to UOG in October of 2011 after 10 years at GCC as associate dean and then Dean of Technology and Student Services which had followed 10 years at GDOE as an English teacher and school administrator. She had a passion for data and continuous improvement and helped guide SOE's accreditation where SOE attained full accreditation under NCATE (7 years) and then AAQEP (also 7 years). Dr. Santos participated in numerous committees within SOE and on campus including General Education, the Faculty Senate, WASC writing team, and even contract negotiations. If you ask her what she'll miss most about education and being on campus, she didn't hesitate when she said "the students."

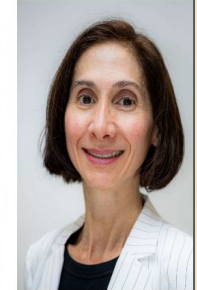
